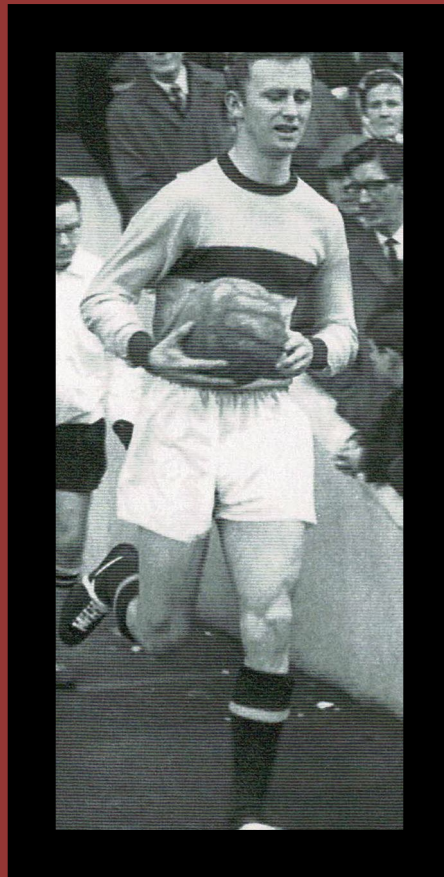

George was signed by Bobby Ancell in the summer of 1960 from Kilmarnock Amateurs and according to the 1960/61 club hand book he was 5' 11" and 12st when he arrived at Fir Park. He didn't play any first team games in seasons 1960/61 except in a solitary Lanarkshire Cup tie. He didn't play any in 1961/62.

In 1962/63 he made 5 league appearances and scored 1 league goal. He made his first team league debut on 30 March 1963 home to Dumbarton in a 0-0 draw and his solitary goal arrived on 13 April 1963 home to Kilmarnock in a 2-1 win.

In 1963/64 George became a regular in the first team playing in 25 league games, scoring 2 goals, 1 in the league and 1 in the Scottish Cup. He played in all the clubs Scottish Cup games that's season. Dumbarton (h) 4-1 win on 25 Jan 1964, Hearts (h) 3-3 draw on 15 Feb 1964, replay on 19 Feb in 2-1 win, Dundee (a) 7 Mar in 1-1 draw and scored his first Scottish Cup goal in the reply at Fir Park on 11 March 1964, 'Well lost 4-2 (McBride scored the other).

Whilst at Fir Park he was capped on 3 occasions for Scotland Under 23's making his debut away to France on 24 May 1964 in a 2-0 Scotland win. He also played at home to Wales on 2 December 1964 in a 3-0 win and home to England on 24 February 1965 in a 0-0 draw. He also represented the Scottish League in a game v the English League in 1965.

He played in 4 Summer Cup games at the end of Season 1963/64 wearing number 6. Games against Kilmarnock (a) on 2 May 1964 drew 2-2 (Lindsay & King og), Airdrie (h) on 6 May lost 2-1 (McBride), Queen of the South (h) on 9 May won 2-0 (McBride 2), Kilmarnock (h) on 13 May lost 4-1 (Weir pen) and Airdrie (a) on 16 May won 2-1 (Coakley, Carlyle).

He played in the 1963/64 Lanarkshire Cup Final in a 3-0 loss to Airdrie. 'Well team was; Wylie, Delaney, R. McCallum, W. McCallum, Murray, Blair, Russell, Thomson, McBride, Gallacher.

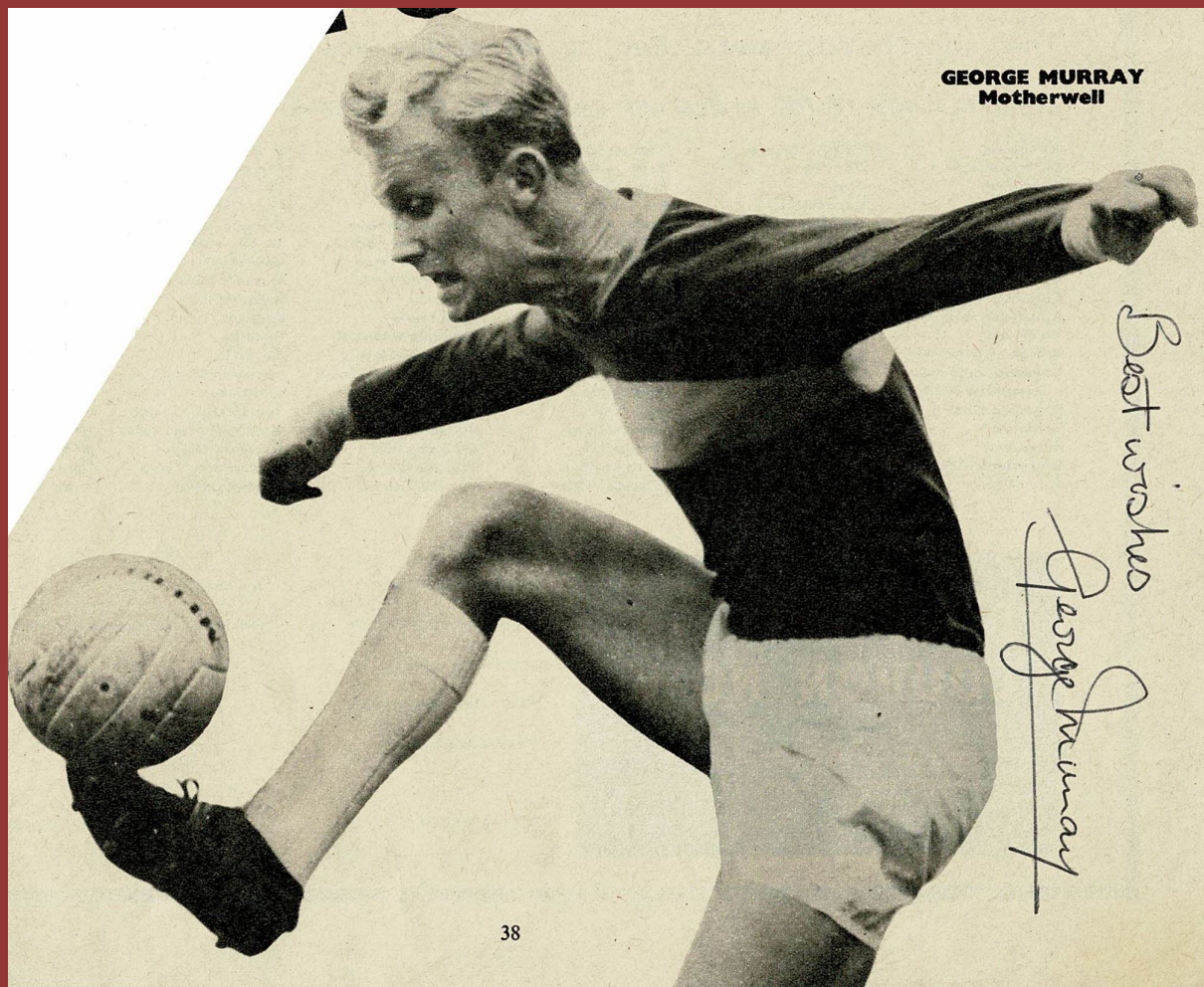
In 1964/65 George played in both legs of the Lanarkshire Cup semi-final v Airdrie, 'Well won the 1ST leg 4-1, lost the 2nd leg 4-1. The tie was decided on a toss-of-the coin, 'Well guessed correct

In the final v Hamilton Accies he scored 2 in a 3-1 'Well victory. 'Well team; Wylie, Thomson, McCallum (R or W), McCann, Delaney, Murray, Hunter, Weir, McBride, Robertson, Hume.

George is the older brother of another Motherwell player, Cameron (Cammy) who played for one season after being signed in the summer of 1972.

George remained at Fir Park for 7 years during which time he made 123 appearances in claret & amber scoring 17 goals before he moved in 1968 to Aberdeen in a deal that saw Jimmy Wilson move in the opposite direction.

This is only a brief summary of his career whilst wearing claret & amber but it can be clearly seen that he is one of the clubs legends and long remembered as a member of THE ANCELL BABES.

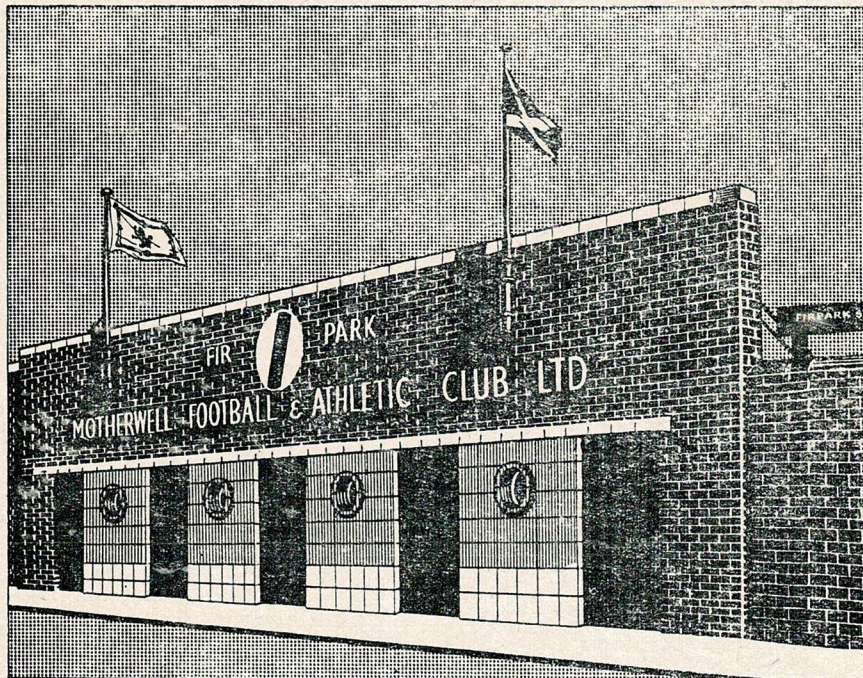

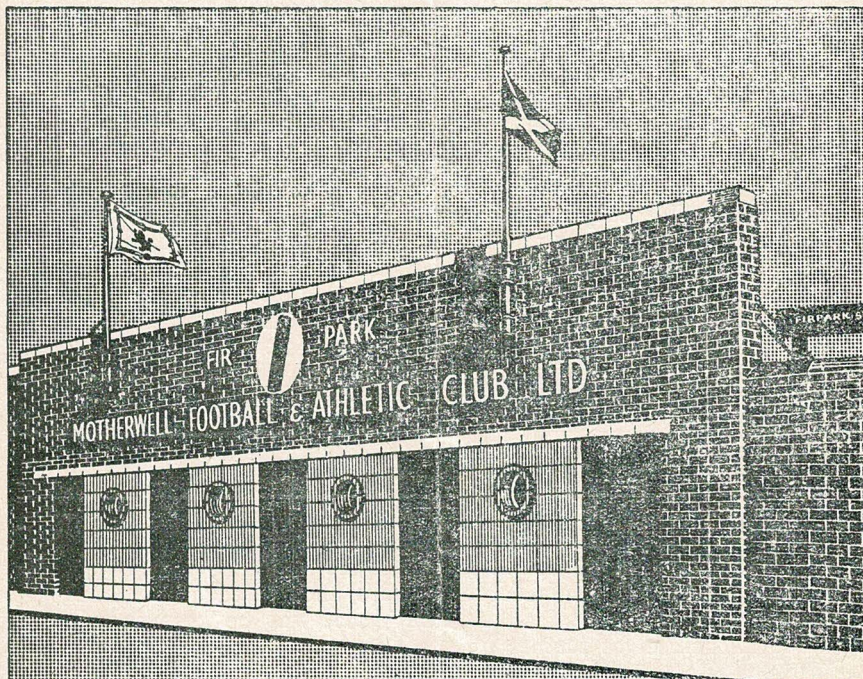

Pat Quinn, who had been so dependable as a penalty kick expert, lost his touch a bit and only scored twice from the "spot." Andy Weir scored one penalty, but the role of "spot-kick kingpin" was taken over by Willie McSeveney. Willie had three goals from the "spot" in the League, one in the League Cup, one in the Scottish Cup and one in the Friendship Cup; he also scored two other goals not from the penalty spot—not bad for a full back.

Probably Motherwell's goal of the season, however, was scored by Pat Delaney in the third round replay of the Scottish Cup at Ibrox, against Rangers. With the score 2-1 in Rangers' favour, Pat gave the keeper no chance with a terrific free kick to draw level just before the interval and paved the way for a great victory in the second half.

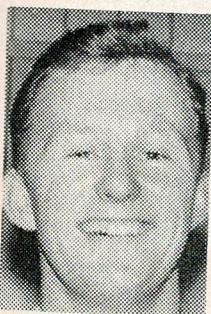

Motherwell players look like coming back into the eye of the selectors, and in 1963-64 a few of them played in representative matches. Joe McBride played centre forward for Scotland against the Scottish League and scored two goals. Pat Delaney, who was one of the pool of reserves, deputised for Yeats in Scotland's side for most of the second half and played very well indeed.

McBride's display in this match made him Scotland's centre in the League National with England at Sunderland on March 18, and Joe capped a good display by scoring the first goal in a 2-2 draw.

Young George Murray, who had his best season since coming to Fir Park,

gained his first honour when he was capped at left half in Scotland's Under Twenty-three team against France, where the Scots side won by three goals to nil.

Keeper Willie Murdoch was again chosen for Amateur Scotland, playing against Ireland in Glasgow, the game ending in a 2-2 draw. Willie has already an Amateur cap against Wales gained in 1963, and last season he was with the Scottish Amateur side which toured Kenya.

Bobby Roberts, now with Leicester City, when with Motherwell at the beginning of the season, played for the Scottish League team against the Irish League. Alan Wyllie was the reserve keeper for this match.

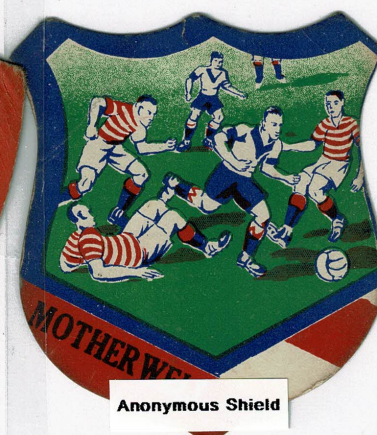
